### Neighborhood Infrastructure Needs Survey Saturday May 5 @ 10:00 a.m. WE NEED YOU!

As beautiful as Pinckney Neighborhood is, there is always room for improvement. This Spring PNA plans to launch a detailed and systematic review of the entire Pinckney Neighborhood to identify sidewalks, streets, drainage, and other infrastructure problems. When the survey is complete, we will compile and prioritize the results and submit a request to the City of Lawrence to address those problems. While we can't be sure the City will be able to correct all the defects we find, other neighborhoods that have used this process have been pleased by the City's response.

Please join us on April 21<sup>st</sup> for the PNA monthly meeting to help us prepare a plan for complete neighborhood survey coverage. We need leaders for the central planning and needs analysis committee as well as volunteers from every sector of the neighborhood to help complete the survey.

We will gather on May 5<sup>th</sup> @ 10:00 a.m. in the Lawrence Memorial Hospital parking lot at 4<sup>th</sup> and Michigan Streets to separate into survey teams. Please bring a digital camera if you have one (nothing fancy needed) and wear good walking shoes. We'll provide light refreshment and give you instructions before you head out with your team for about an hour to an hour and a half of walking through your designated streets in the neighborhood.

# **PNA Annual Fundraising Effort**

**Reaching out to Pinckney Area Businesses and Individuals** For the past few years, PNA has combined preparation for the Potluck Picnic with a fundraising drive to support the picnic and other activities provided to the neighborhood by PNA. There are many ways you can help – first and foremost, your direct financial contribution provides the most flexibility to fund projects, as needed. # Annual Curbside Brush Pick-up Monday April 30th

Yes, it's that time of year again – springtime yard clean-up! To help dispose of your trimmed brush and tree limbs, we've scheduled a special tour through the neighborhood on April 30<sup>th</sup> for the Lawrence Parks Department's wood chipper / shredder. The city crew will pick-up and process brush and oversize yard debris you leave at the curb. Brush does not need to be bundled, and limbs should have their butt-end facing the street. This is for brush and limbs only, since other yard waste is routinely picked up by sanitation crews each Monday. The brush and limbs will be chipped up to add to the city's compost and mulch piles. The city is not able to dispose of railroad ties and other wood fencing materials. Also note that city staff is not allowed to go into private yards to clean up or retrieve the debris.

If you need assistance in bringing your debris to the curb, please call Linda Bush (856-6435) or send an email to **Pinckney.Neighborhood@gmail.com** to arrange assistance from some helpful neighbors. Although it may take a couple of days for the crew to work its way through the neighborhood, **please have your brush ready at the curb by the morning of Monday April 30**<sup>th</sup>.

### Notice from the City of Lawrence Reductions Available to Low-Income Elderly for Water and Sewer Service Charges

A low-income elderly person (one who is sixty years of age or more on or before the 1st day of January of the year in which the reduced services charge is applicable) who has an income during the preceding calendar year from all sources of less than \$11,979 (or any elderly person who is the head of a family with a family income during the receding calendar year from all sources of less than \$16,181) may qualify for a reduction in city services charges. If approved, a low-income elderly person shall pay a flat rate monthly charge per dwelling of 35% the regular monthly residential water and sanitary sewer charge. Applications for reduced charges shall be on forms supplied by the City, filed or mailed to the Utility Billing Division of the Department of finance.
