

Lawrence Police Dept. Neighborhood Resource Officers

The Lawrence Police Department has two officers assigned to a special Neighborhood Resource detail. These officers promote open communications with the public and pay special attention to issues important to neighborhoods, such as code enforcement, police enforcement, crime prevention and any non-emergency concerns.

The officers, Trent McKinley (pictured) and Rob Neff, attended the February 20th PNA meeting to introduce themselves and discuss how they may be of service to the community. These officers try to monitor ongoing concerns in different neighborhoods and act as a liaison between different City and law enforcement branches and with residents. Their services provide a continuity of support for addressing issues of concern within the neighborhood.



Pothole Reporting!

After all the nasty, cold weather this past winter, the streets in Lawrence are now riddled with potholes. The Lawrence Public Works Department is busy filling potholes and repairing streets. Woody Park & Recreation Resources for Pinckney

PNA continues to consider options for a proposal to Lawrence Memorial Hospital regarding Woody Park, the small baseball field located just north of the hospital on Maine St. Last summer, LMH officials notified PNA that the hospital would like to use at least part of Woody Park for a parking area. The City previously allowed LMH to use part of the park for a helicopter pad, thereby diminishing the size of the park and affecting its use as a viable ball field. The park gets its name from Mr. Elgin Woody, who for many years maintained a baseball field on the site for the benefit of Lawrence's black population during segregation.

A subcommittee will be presenting a draft proposal during the April 17th PNA monthly meeting regarding future use of Woody Park and options for creating new park space/athletic resources to serve the Pinckney Neighborhood, particularly for the northern and western areas of the neighborhood. We welcome and encourage the participation of Pinckney residents at the April meeting to discuss this important proposal to honor the historical significance of this site, ensure sound environmental and community-friendly future use of the site, and address park/recreation needs for the community. Annual Neighborhood Clean-up & Curbside Brush Pick-up 10:00 am Saturday, June 12, 2010

Put on your sunscreen and work gloves and join your neighbors in our **annual park clean-up**! Pinckney Neighborhood has four parks to enjoy: Burcham Park, Clinton Park, Constant Park, and Woody Park. Speed Limit on 4th Street west of Michigan

After the speed limit on 4th Street west of Michigan was raised from 30 mph to 35 mph, several residents contacted PNA questioning the rationale behind the change and raising concerns about public safety, particularly regarding children, bicyclists and dog walkers. Of particular concern was the lack of prior notice to the community about the requested change, and therefore lack of an opportunity to provide input. PNA President Steve Braswell raised these concerns to the Lawrence Traffic Commission at their March meeting. The Board decided not to reverse its earlier decision to raise the speed limit. PNA will work to stay abreast of issues before the City Commission and other City boards and welcomes your input and assistance in raising issues of concern for our neighborhood.
