Pinckney Neighborhood Events Focus on Fun and Community

Potluck Picnic & Kids' Art Show: This year's picnic & art show on June 16th was another great success. With generous contributions from many local businesses and families (see page 2 for a complete list), we once again we able to chow-down on hot dogs, Italian ice cream and many home made goodies, get a haircut, listen to great music, enjoy our kids' creativity and bounce in a castle. To refresh your memory, Trunk-or-Treat is an opportunity to decorate the trunk of a car, bed of a truck, back of a van, a table, a tent, a booth (you name it, really) in the Halloween spirit for kids (of all ages) to visit and enjoy. You might choose to pass out candy or other refreshments, or have a game of skill, silly entertainment or any other Halloween or carnival-like activity. Go it alone or join forces with other Pinckney neighbors. As long as it's kid-friendly and in relative good taste, your imagination is your only limit. Everyone is welcome to participate, even if you don't have an actual kid in your household. FIGHTING HUNGER JUST FOOD DOUGLAS COUNTY

Food insecurity is a real and serious problem in our community. In fact, in the Lawrence School District alone, 32% of our students receive free and reduced lunches – that's about 1 in every 3 kids. To combat this problem, Just Food, an innovative leader in alleviating the problem of hunger in Douglas County, works with partner agencies and government and community leaders to build public support to ensure no one in our community goes hungry.

Through its **Client Services Division**, Just Food serves nearly 8,000 individuals each month who are in need of food assistance, 40% of whom are children under the age of 18. By providing a walk-in pantry, mobile pantry, daily fresh market and an innovative cooking and nutrition program called "Culinary Stars," Just Food doesn't just feed people, it helps them get back on their feet and moves them to a place of self-sufficiency.

Just Food's **Partner Services Division** serves 40 Douglas County agencies by providing food at no cost to them. It serves 3,500 each month through collection of food and monetary donations from individuals, schools and businesses.

Just Food relies wholly on the generosity of Douglas County to continue to feed thousands of food insecure residents each month. This year along, Just Food will distribute more than 1,000,000 meals in our community; that's up a staggering 12% from last year.

Pinckney Tunnel Beautification Project

Pinckney Elementary School PTO is collaborating with Van Go, Inc., a local arts-based social service agency that employs underserved and high-needs youth, to beautify a vital safe passageway – the Pinckney Tunnel. The PTO wants to turn something we need into something we love.

Built in the 1950s, the Pinckney Tunnel links two historic neighborhoods that lay at the feet of Mount Oread, the University of Kansas, and the birthplace of the Civil War. The tunnel provides safe passage underneath 6^{th} Street, a busy multiple-lane highway. Some Pinckney residents need the tunnel to access downtown.
