City Working on Trails between Burcham & Constant Parks

Rowan Green with the Lawrence Parks and Recreation informed PNA that the City will be working on the trail along the river that runs between Burcham and Constant Park. The work will be starting soon and will likely be completed in late summer to fall. At one time there were two foot bridges on that trail. Then a few years ago, one of the bridges was replaces with tubes.

In the near future, the City plans to replace the remaining foot bridge with tubes and as part of this project and will need to widen the trail enough to get the equipment in to this location. This will also give them the opportunity to better maintain the trail. It will also allow the Forestry equipment to get up and down the trail to take care of large trees that have dead hanging branches etc.

The City does not intend to remove any large trees but rather will be removing small underbrush and volunteer growth, just enough to create space to get the equipment in to replace the bridge and then be able to maintain the trail. The City may also at some point add an ag-lime surface and then perhaps bring the end of the trail up to where it would connect to the wide path in Constant Park.

Work at Water Treatment Plant Scheduled for Winter Months

The City's Department of Utilities informed PNA that starting in about November there will be some major working occurring on North Indian between 3rd and 2nd Streets, inside Burcham Park, north of the park, and across the river. The City will keep PNA informed of the progress and we will provide updates on the PNA website (www.pincknevneighborhood.org). The work will include a brief closure of Burcham Park to vehicular traffic. The City will make an effort to minimize the impact of the work on the neighborhood and users of the park. The work to be performed includes construction of a new water intake, removal of two nonfunctioning water intake structures, construction of a new line across the river to serve the east side of town.

Volunteers Needed for Multi-city Bicycle & Pedestrian Counts

Lawrence, Eudora and Baldwin City need volunteers to manually count bicycles and pedestrians at several locations across in each city next month. The Lawrence-Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Organization, the City of Lawrence, Eudora and Baldwin City will be conducting bicycle and pedestrian counts on Wednesday, September 11& 12 from 10:00 a.m. to noon and from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. and also on Saturday, September 7, 14, 21, & 28 from noon to 2:00 p.m. Those interested in volunteering for one or all of the scheduled count times are required to attend one of the following training sessions:

Lawrence, Kansas - Lawrence City Commission Room

- -Monday, August 26, Noon 1:00 p.m.
- -Tuesday, September 29, 5:30-6:30 p.m.

Eudora, Kansas - Parks & Recreation Community Room -Thursday, September 5, 6:00 - 7:00 p.m.

Baldwin City, Kansas – Baldwin Public Library -Wednesday, August 28, 6:00 - 7:00 p.m.

Volunteers will be taught the National Bicycle and Pedestrian Documentation Project method created by Alta Planning and Design and the Institute of Transportation Engineers. Volunteers trained in previous years are not required to attend the training again this year.

Data collected on bicycling and walking will assist city and regional leaders in estimating usage and demand for bicycle and pedestrian facilities. The counts will also be used to track the region's progress on increasing the use of non-motorized transportation, strengthen grant applications to leverage additional federal funding for bicycle and pedestrian projects, evaluate existing projects, and help determine the location of future investments.
